

Cookie policy for www.bacca.pl Website

Bacca puts all efforts to make the Website easy to use. To improve the convenience of using the Website, we use cookies. With the use of cookie technology we collect only anonymous statistical data about users.

How do cookies work?

1. If the User wishes to fully utilise the content and personalised functions of www.bacca.pl website, they must accept cookies (it is often a default setting) on their device (PC, tablet or mobile phone).
2. Cookies are text files saved on the User's computer to collect standard information about logging in and User behaviour on the website. They are used to provide optimal service when visiting the Website and allow for the faster and easier access to information.
3. Cookies are not used to process personal data and their content does not allow for the User identification.
4. Cookies cannot be used to obtain data from the User's hard drive, User's e-mail address or their personal data.
5. Data gathered through cookies are entirely anonymous.
6. Cookies do not destroy or damage in any way software installed on the User's device, Internet browsing software or files saved on the device. Cookies have no negative influence on the performance or functionality of the User's device and they do not cause configuration changes in Internet browsing software.

Limiting, blocking or deleting cookies

1. The User may limit the use, block or delete cookies for the purpose of using the Website.
2. The User may do that by changing appropriate privacy settings of the Internet browser (Firefox, Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, etc.) they use.
3. Disabling or limiting cookies in the User's Internet browser may cause difficulties or disable some of the Website functions.

Use of Google Analytics

1. www.bacca.pl Website uses Google Analytics tool to analyse how the Users use the Website. That tool uses cookies.
2. Information gathered through cookies is used to assess the way the Website is used by the User and to prepare statistical reports concerning activity on the Website.
3. Bacca shall not use the aforesaid analytical tool (and shall not allow third parties to use it) for the purpose of tracking or collecting personal data of persons visiting the Website.

How to enable/delete/block cookies in particular Internet browsers?

Chrome

1. Enabling cookies

- At the top of a Chrome window click on "Chrome's menu" (an icon depicting three horizontal lines in the browser's toolbar).
- Select "Settings".
- Click on "Show advanced settings".
- In the "Privacy" section click on "Content settings".
- In the "Cookies" section click on "All cookies and site data" to open a dialogue box called "Cookies and other data".
- If you want to allow both your own and third-party cookies, select "Allow local data to be set".
- To accept only your own cookies, select "Block all third-party cookies without exception".

2. Deleting cookies

- At the top of a Chrome window click on "Chrome's menu" (an icon depicting three horizontal lines in the browser's toolbar).
- Select "Settings".
- Click on "Show advanced settings".
- In the "Privacy" section click on "Content settings".
- In the "Cookies" section click on "All cookies and site data" to open a dialogue box called "Cookies and other data".
- To delete all cookies, click on "Delete all" at the bottom of the dialogue box.
- To delete a particular cookie, select the website, which created it, select the cookie and click on "Delete".
- In the dialogue box called "Clear browsing data" you can delete all cookies created in a given period.

3. Blocking all cookies

- At the top of a Chrome window click on "Chrome's menu" (an icon depicting three horizontal lines in the browser's toolbar).
- Select "Settings".
- Click on "Show advanced settings".
- In the "Privacy" section click on "Content settings".
- In the "Cookies" section click on "All cookies and site data" to open a dialogue box called "Cookies and other data".
- Select "Block sites from setting any data". Remember that this setting prevents most websites, which require logging in, from operation. Every time when the browser blocks a cookie, you will see an icon with a red X in the address bar.

4. Blocking only third-party cookies

- At the top of a Chrome window click on “Chrome’s menu” (an icon depicting three horizontal lines in the browser’s toolbar).
- Select “Settings”.
- Click on “Show advanced settings”.
- In the “Privacy” section click on “Content settings”.
- In the “Cookies” section click on “All cookies and site data” to open a dialogue box called “Cookies and other data”.
- Select “Ignore exceptions and block third-party cookies from being set”. Ticking this selection field results in rejecting third-party cookies from the website, even if it has been added to the “Exceptions” list and can create cookies on your computer.

Firefox

1. Enabling cookies

- At the top of a Firefox window click on “Firefox” (in XP system click on “Tools” menu) and select “Options”.
- Select “Privacy” panel.
- From the “Firefox will” drop-down menu select “Use custom settings for history”.
- Tick “Accept cookies” to enable cookie support.
- If you are trying to solve a problem caused by cookies, check if “Accept cookies from other sites” is also selected.
- Select for how long cookies will be kept:
 - Keep until: “They expire” - a cookie will be deleted after it reaches the expiry date determined by the website sending the cookie;
 - Keep until: “Firefox closes” - cookies stored on a computer will be deleted after Firefox closes;
 - Keep until: “Ask me every time” - each time a website tries to send a cookie, the browser will display a prompt, allowing you to decide on cookie storage.
- Press OK to close the Option window.

2. Deleting cookies from one site

- At the top of a Firefox window click on “Firefox” (in XP system click on “Tools” menu) and select “Options”.
- Select the “Privacy” panel.
- From the drop-down menu select “Use custom settings for history”.
- Press “Show cookies...” button. “Cookies” window will be displayed.
- In the “Search” field type the name of a site, whose cookies you want to delete. Cookies matching search criteria will be displayed.
- From the list select cookies that you want to delete and click on “Delete cookie”.

- Select the first cookie and press "Shift+End" to select all cookies.
- Press "Close" button to close "Cookies" window.

3. Deleting all cookies

- At the top of a Firefox window click on "Firefox", go to the "History" menu (in XP system click on "Tools" menu) and select "Clear browsing history".
- Under "Time range to clear" select "Everything".
- Click on the arrow next to "Details" to expand the list of history elements.
- Select "Cookies" and check that other elements, which you do not want to delete, are not selected.
- To delete cookies, press "Delete now" button and close "Clear entire history" window.

4. Blocking cookies for a single site

- Go to the site, for which you want to block cookies from being set in Firefox.
- Right-click on the site and select "Page information".
- In the "Page information" box select "Permissions" panel.
- Under "Allow cookies" untick "Use default".
- Change settings to "Block".

5. Blocking cookies for all sites

- At the top of a Firefox window click on "Firefox" (in Windows XP system click on "Tools" menu) and select "Options".
- Select "Privacy" panel.
- From the "Firefox will" drop-down menu select "Use custom settings for history".
- Untick the "Accept cookies" option.
- Press OK to close the Option window.

6. Disabling third-party cookies

- At the top of a Firefox window click on "Firefox" (in Windows XP system click on "Tools" menu) and select "Options".
- Select "Privacy" panel.
- From "Firefox will" drop-down menu select "Use custom settings for history".
- Untick the "Accept third-party cookies" option.
- Press OK to close the Option window.

Internet Explorer 9

1. Enabling cookies

- Click on the "Tools" button and then on the "Internet options".
- Go to the "Privacy" tab and then on the "Advanced" button.
- Here you can freely choose how you browser will handle cookies.

2. Deleting cookies

- At the top of a browser window click on the "Tools" button, switch to the "Security" tab and select "Delete browsing history".
- Tick "Cookies" and then click on the "Delete" button.

3. Blocking cookies

- Click on the "Tools" button and then on the "Internet options".
- Go to the "Privacy" tab and click on the "Advanced" button.
- You may select "Block" for both "first-party cookies" and "third-party cookies".

4. Blocking or allowing cookies from specific websites

- Click on the "Tools" button and then on the "Internet options" command.
- Go to the "Privacy" tab and move the slider to a position between the top and bottom to prevent blocking or allowing all cookies
- Click on the "Sites" button.
- In the "Address of website" box, type a website address and then click on "Block or Allow".
- As you type, a list of websites that you have already visited will be displayed. You can click on an item in the list to display it in the "Address of website" box.
- Repeat the above step for each website you want to block or allow. When you are finished, click on the OK button.
- Move the slider back to the position it was originally in, and then click on the OK button.

Opera

1. Enabling cookies

- At the top of a browser window go to "Settings", then "Preferences" and select "Advanced".
- Select "Cookies".
- Tick "Accept" - in this case all cookies will be allowed.
- Tick "Accept only from the site I visit" - in this case all cookies from sites other than the one you visit will be rejected.

2. Deleting cookies

- At the top of a browser window go to "Settings", then "Preferences" and select "Advanced".
- Select "Cookies".
- To automatically delete all new cookies when exiting the browser, select "Delete new cookies when exiting Opera".
- To delete selected or all cookies, select "Manage cookies".
- Tick the selected cookie or all cookies and click on "Delete".

Safari

1. Enabling cookies

- At the top of a browser window select "Preferences" from the action menu and click on "Security". The action menu is located in the top right corner of a Safari window and is marked with a gear icon.
- Under "Accept cookies" you may choose whether and when Safari should accept cookies from visited websites. If you want to find out more about particular options, click on the "Help" button (with a question mark).

2. Deleting cookies

- At the top of a browser window select "Preferences" under "Safari" tab and click on "Privacy". The action menu is located in the top right corner of a Safari window and is marked with a gear icon.
- Click on "Show Cookies"
- Check one or more cookies and click on "Delete" or "Delete all".
- Once the cookies are deleted, click on "Done".
